Grilling Fire Safety

With fall upon us and the heat subsiding, more people are getting outside and grilling or smoking their favorite foods. Many people are spending time with neighbors and friends – building great memories and safety is vitally important. The Grapevine Fire Department and the National Fire Protection Association recommend the following:

- Only use your grill outside.
- Keep your grill away from the side of your home (City ordinance is 10 feet from building).
- Keep your grill away from deck rails.

- Clean your grill after each use. This prevents the buildup of grease that can start a fire.
 - Open your gas grill lid before lighting.
 - Keep a three foot safe zone around your grill.
 - Place the coals from your grill in a metal can with a lid once they have cooled.
 - Always keep an eye on a grill, fire pit, or patio torches.
- Please refer to nfpa.org for additional information concerning propane and charcoal grills.

Clean Storm Drains = Clean Creeks + Lakes

Chemicals, sediment, and trash are hazardous to fish, aquatic creatures, and terrestrial animals in and around our stream and lake environments. Pollutants dumped in storm drain inlets are discharged through storm drain outfalls and eventually enter either Grapevine Lake (where we get our drinking water), or the Trinity River, without being filtered or treated.

“No Dumping” markers have been placed on storm drain inlets throughout Grapevine to deter dumping and provide the phone number (817.410.3330) needed to report unauthorized dumping and pollution. A new program of marking storm drain outfalls is currently underway. Each new marker prominently indicates the Regional Watershed and Local Watershed that the water flows to after it enters the storm drain. If you notice something other than storm water entering a storm drain inlet or discharging from

a storm drain outfall, please contact the Environmental Services Division of Public Works at 817.410.3330 with the storm drain ID provided on the marker. Keep our waterways clean and healthy by reporting pollution.



Backflow Testing for Sprinkler Irrigation

How do you keep bacteria and lawn care pollutants out of your sink? Make sure the backflow prevention assembly on your irrigation system is working. State requirements mandate testing upon installation; however, as the irrigation systems age, the assemblies begin to fail. In order to be sure no pollutants can leak back into your home; assemblies should be tested once each year.

State's requirements make it the responsibility of the irrigation installer and City to ensure that an approved device is installed. It is the responsibility of the owner of the irrigation system to ensure such an assembly is present and in proper working order. Testing is

conducted by State licensed Backflow Prevention Assembly Testers. If you have questions about backflow prevention assemblies, please call the City's Environmental Department at 817.410.3570.

The Grapevine Animal Shelter and Adoption Center is a division of the Grapevine Police Department. The Animal Services team assists in managing pets, answering questions about pet requirements, and help reduce animal concerns within the City. They work to place available dogs and cats with good families/homes between the hours of 9am and 5pm, Monday through Friday and from 9 am to 12 pm on Saturdays. All adoption fees are \$40 per pet. Crime Prevention Extravaganza



On Saturday, September 26 from 10am to 2pm, the Grapevine Police Department will be offering a free 'One Stop Shop' across the street from the Police Department, located at 307 W Dallas Road.

Residents will be given an opportunity to have their Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) permanently etched (acid etched) into the major windows. VIN etching is a theft deterrent and may entitle you to an auto insurance premium discount. Texas ranks number two in the nation in auto theft, with a vehicle stolen every eight minutes. This process makes the VIN easily accessible for law enforcement officers to identify your vehicle, discouraging a criminal from stealing your vehicle due to the ease that it can be traced.

Residents will be given the opportunity to shred unwanted, confidential documents, as Data Shredding Services will be on location. Residents will also be given the opportunity to surrender expired, unwanted, or unused pharmaceutical controlled substances for destruction as we

will be participating in a nationwide collaborative effort with the DEA for National Take-Back.

Child Passenger Safety Seat Inspections will also be conducted on location. The inspection enables parents and caregivers to receive education and hands-on assistance with the proper use of child restraint systems and seat belts. The Grapevine Citizen's Police Academy Alumni Association will be conducting a bake sale at the event. Activity and coloring books, stickers and safety literature will be given to children.
