## May 11th City Elections

The Grapevine City Election is May 11. The ballot will contain two City Council races—Place 3 and Place 4, along with a Charter proposition relative to Council term limits. For more information about the election, please visit [grapevinetexas.gov](http://grapevinetexas.gov). The last day to register to vote is April 11. Voter registration applications are available in the City Secretary's Office, 200 South Main Street and the Grapevine Library, 1201 Municipal Way.

Early voting will be conducted at the Grapevine Community Activities Center, 1175 Municipal Way, in the lobby area:

April 29–May 3	8 am–5 pm	Monday–Friday
May 4	7 am–7 pm	Saturday
May 5	11 am–4 pm	Sunday
May 6–May 7	7 am–7 pm	Monday–Tuesday

Election Day voting is also being held at the Community Activities Center on Saturday, May 11 from 7 am to 7 pm.

An area for "Voter Parking Only" will be reserved during early voting and on Election Day at the Community Activities Center.

- Live concert by 'Vocal Trash'



# Bike Safety

As you may have noticed, more and more people are riding bicycles in Grapevine. There are a lot of reasons for this:

- great riding-weather
- gas is expensive
- not old enough to drive
- don't own a vehicle
- fun way to commute
- clean and green
- exercise
- 40% of all trips are two miles or less

According to Texas law, bicycles are treated like cars while on the roadways. Since road bikes can easily reach city speed limits, it is preferable (and legal) to have them traveling on roads instead of mixing in with slower foot, cruiser and wheelchair traffic on standard sidewalks. This works as long as drivers and cyclists all understand and follow the rules. So, to help keep everyone safe, here are some rules:



## For Cyclists:

- By law, bicycles have the same rights and responsibilities as motorized vehicles when traveling on streets.
- Obey all traffic signs. Stop at all stop signs and red lights. You can be ticketed just like a car.
- Always wear a helmet. It is the law in some cities and just plain smart in all cities.
- Signal your intentions with hand signals — turning right, left and stopping. Do not signal only if it is unsafe to take a hand off the handlebars.
- Always look before changing lanes or your spot in a lane.
- Ride in the same direction as traffic.
- Ride as far to the right “as is safe”. Sometimes this means riding more in the center of the lane if confronted with road debris, parked cars, narrow lanes & pot holes.
- ‘Take the lane’ if the roadway is 14’ wide or less or to make a left hand turn.
- Keep at least one hand on the handlebar at all times.
- Riding two abreast is okay, but don't impede traffic. But don't ride more than two abreast.
- Make eye contact with drivers at intersections. Make sure they see you.
- Wear reflective and bright clothing to be seen.

- A white light on the front and red light on the back is more visible to all traffic at night than reflectors.
- Always keep your bike in good working order and tires properly inflated.
- Be polite and friendly especially to those cars that pass you with at least three feet of space between you and them.



## For Cars:

- By law, bicycles have the same rights and responsibilities as motorized vehicles when traveling on streets.
- Always be looking for bikes on the road.
- Cars are required to yield right-of-way to a bicycle.
- Treat that bike in front of you as you would a slower moving car and don't pass unless it is legal and you can come no closer than three feet to the cyclist.
- Do not speed up to cut a bike off when approaching a stop sign. They can't stop any faster than you and they will dent your car when they land on it.
- Stay as far back as possible.
- Pass bikes and all vulnerable road users with at least three feet of distance between your car and them.
- Look both ways for cyclists before turning right.
- Don't honk at cyclists--that horn is much louder outside of your car.

Remember, that cyclist is somebody's child, parent, grandparent or best friend and they are helping keep your air clean and your health insurance lower.

# What you need to know: Grapevine's Solicitor Ordinance

Solicitors who wish to go door-to-door in the city limits of Grapevine, must first obtain the required City of Grapevine permit and display the permit card upon request. For safety reasons, each person soliciting should wear a brightly colored traffic vest so they are easily identified.

Each person is also required to adhere to specific hours in which to solicit. Any person acting as a solicitor is only allowed to go to a private residence or a business between the hours of 9 am and 5 pm, Monday through Saturday excluding Federal holidays or on any day where the Department of Homeland Security has declared an Orange or Red State of Alert.

Children 16 years of age, or younger, are not permitted to solicit within the City unless they are actively supervised by an adult at least 18 years of age who is permitted or registered, depending on the type of solicitation. This will not apply to Girl Scout or Boy Scout type sales where an adult/parent are accompanying them.

When someone comes to your door soliciting, ALWAYS ask for their permit. If they don't have one, call the Grapevine Police Department to report them.

## Grapevine Household Hazardous Waste Event March 30

The City of Grapevine will be hosting its annual Household Hazardous Waste Event Saturday, March 30 from 8 - 11:30 am. This event is for Grapevine residents ONLY. Proof of residency (driver's license or utility bill) is required. The event will be hosted at the City's Municipal Service Center, 501 Shady Brook Drive.

Acceptable items will be any household hazardous waste (paint, oil, herbicides, pesticides, cleaners, pharmaceuticals, fluorescent bulbs, printer cartridges, vehicle and household batteries, etc.).

Items that will NOT be accepted are: unknown waste, ammunition/explosives, closed cylinders (i.e., extinguishers, propane tanks), medical waste, radioactive material, commercial or business waste.

Other items accepted at this event include:

- Documents to be securely shredded
- Electronic waste
- Styrofoam (clean, white packing foam and packing peanuts)
- Cell phones and PDAs
- Eye glasses
- Hearing aids
- Mattresses
- Vehicle tires
- Re-usable items (sneakers, gardening tools, and books).
- Canned and dry food goods

and toiletries will also be collected for GRACE.

Grapevine residents who cannot attend this event can take their household hazardous waste to the Environmental Collection Center located at 6400 Bridge Street in Fort Worth, 817.871.5257. The ECC hours are Thursday & Friday 11 am - 7 pm and Saturday 9 am - 3 pm. This service is provided free of charge to Grapevine residents.


