

Hello Neighbors,

Like most homeowners, you probably spent the winter months thinking about the various home improvements you would like to make. Unfortunately, spring is also a time when scam artists can come out of the woodwork to prey on innocent homeowners. Some are actual scam artists, while others are just unethical.

Protect yourself by comparing prices, talking to friends and family to get names of reputable contractors they have used and calling references. Doing the research to protect yourself is much easier than paying the consequences.

Below is a list of some of the most common home improvement scams. Beware of the following key phrases, and remember, if it sounds too good to be true, it probably is.

"I just happen to be working in your neighborhood." You will hear this when a contractor appears at your residence unsolicited to inform you they noticed some problems with your home's chimney, windows, plumbing, roof, etc.

"I have materials left over from another job and can give you a good deal." The truth is good contractors order enough supplies to meet the needs of each job, as often the price of supplies is included in the contract.

"I want cash up front." This contractor will take your money and disappear before or (even worse) after your project has started. Also be careful of contractors who want money up front to purchase supplies. One recommendation is to create a payment schedule with the contractor up front, where you pay some portion only upon completion of each portion of the project. This will also allow you to observe the quality of the work they are performing.

"I have a special offer that is good for today only." Any time a contractor puts pressure on you to act quickly about making a home repair decision that is a red flag.

GREENER Cleaner Grapevine



Mosquito season is almost here!



As we approach the summer season, remember to defend yourself against mosquitoes and the potential of West Nile Virus infection. Remember the "Four D's"

DUSK/DAWN – The times when mosquitoes are most active, so try and stay indoors.

DRESS – Wear long sleeves and pants when outside.

DEET (N, N-diethyl-m-toluamide) – use insect repellants containing DEET, the most effective active ingredient in repelling mosquitoes and other insects.

DRAIN – Make sure any object that holds standing water is drained. This includes pet bowls, flower pots, tires, etc.

Also, be mindful of overwatering your yard or water leaks around the house. Runoff can collect in areas, including your yard, and create mosquito breeding habitat. Standing water can be treated with larvicide to prevent mosquitoes from maturing into adults.

Lake Park Passes

Annual Lake Park passes may be purchased for unlimited use of the City of Grapevine boat ramps for a calendar year. The pass also entitles the holder to unlimited access into Meadowmere Park and Rockledge Park for a calendar year and access into The Vineyards Campground & Cabins while visiting a registered guest. Passes are effective from January 1 through December 31 of the calendar year purchased.

Applicant should indicate on the application form the type of pass preferred. Lake Parks passes may be purchased at The Vineyards Campground Camp Store, 1501 N. Dooley Street, Meadowmere Park, 3000 Meadowmere Lane, or Rockledge Park, 3600 Pilot Point. For more information, please visit playgrapevine.com/boatramps.



Pool Draining Reminders

As we enter the summer months, many City of Grapevine pool owners will drain their pools in order to refill them with fresh water. The City would like to remind residents that pools should be drained to the sanitary sewer system and not to the street where it enters the storm drain system. Pool water discharged to the storm drain system may contain chlorine, have a low pH due to its acid content, or contain high levels of algae (if the pool has not been maintained).

All of these situations can be detrimental to the creeks, ponds, and lakes that the storm drain system discharges into.

Most residential pools in the City are plumbed to the sanitary sewer, generally through the filter backwash systems. This allows the pool pump system to drain the pool to the sanitary sewer. A garden hose may also be used to siphon water from the pool into the residence's sanitary sewer cleanout. Additionally, pool backwash systems should not be rinsed to the streets. Backwash materials should be collected, dried and placed in the trash for disposal.

Pool water discharged to the storm drain system may contain chlorine, have a low pH due to its acid content, or contain high levels of algae (if the pool has not been maintained).
